Now therefore, it is hereby enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Republic of Liberia, in Legislature assembled:

Chapter 1: Short Title

Section 1.1: This Act repeals the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms and provides for the establishment of the Liberia National Commission on Arms and shall be cited as the “Arms Commission Act” (2021).

Chapter II: Definitions

Section 2.1: For the purpose of this Act, the following words or phrases shall be defined as follows, unless the context otherwise requires:

“AMMUNITION” means the devices destined to be shot or projected through the means of arms specified in the National Control List such as small arms and light weapons including, among others, cartridges, projectiles and missiles for light weapons, mobile containers with missiles or projectiles for anti-aircraft or anti-tank single action systems.

“AFL”- means Armed Forces of Liberia:

“BROKERING”: means a work carried out as an intermediary between any manufacturer, supplier or distributor of conventional arms including small arms and light weapons and any buyer or user; this includes the prevention of financial support and the transportation of conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunition and other related materials.

“CIVILIAN ARM”: Means a shoulder-fired single barrel gun used exclusively for hunting purposes.

“COMMISSION”: means the Liberia National Commission on Arms established under Section 1 of chapter III of this Act.

“COMMISSIONER”: means a member of the Liberia National Commission on Arms.

“CONVENTIONAL ARMS”: All arms specified in the National Control List including small arms, light weapons, ammunition, and other related materials.

“EXPLOSIVE”: means a reactive substance that contains a great amount of potential energy that can produce a sudden, almost instantaneous, release of gas, heat, and Pressure accompanied by light and loud noise when subjected to a certain amount of shock, pressure, or temperature; can be classified into one of these three large categories: low, high, and nuclear explosives. Examples of explosives are: Black/Gun powder (low explosives), Dynamites (high explosives), trinitrotoluene or TNT (high explosive). Explosive devices may also include mines, explosive detonated by remote control or other electronic means and hand grenades and other military items which are not covered by the 8+2 categories of the ATT;

“FACA”: means the Firearms and Ammunition Control Act as amended.

“GENDER BALANCE”: means those appointed to serve as Commissioners should include males and females.

“ILLICIT”: means all that is carried out in violation of this Act or any applicable law.

“LIGHT WEAPONS”: means any man-portable lethal weapon that expels or launches, is designed to expel or launch, or may be readily converted to expel or launch a shot, bullet or projectile by the action of an explosive, that is designed to be used by one or several members of armed forces serving as a crew including heavy machine guns, portable grenade launchers mobile or mounted, portable anti-aircraft canons, non-recoil guns, portable anti-tank missile launchers or rocket launchers, portable anti-aircraft missile launchers, mortars with a caliber or less than 100 millimeters.

“NATIONAL ARMS REGISTRY” means database and/or records of all listed in the National Control List.

“PROVEN MISCONDUCT”: means consistent with due process, removal from office for breach of duties, abuse of office, conviction of felony, and corruption;

“SEMI-FINANCIAL AUTONOMY”: means in addition to its budgetary support from the Government of Liberia, the Commission shall have financial autonomy over its internal revenues generated from payment of fees for licenses and permits, and fines for administrative sanctions.

“SMALL ARMS”: means any man-portable lethal weapon that expels or launches, is designed to expels or launch, or may be readily converted to expel or launch a shot, bullet or projectile by the action of an explosive, that is designed to be used by one person and which includes notably firearms and other destructive arms or devices such as exploding bombs, incendiary bombs, or gas bomb, a grenade, a rocket launcher, a missile, a missile system or land mine, revolvers and pistols with automatic loading, rifles and carbines, machine guns, assault rifles and light machine guns; for the purpose of this Act, small arms shall refer to shoulder fired single-barrel guns used exclusively for hunting.

“TECHNICAL COMMITTEE ON ARMS”: Means the Committee established under this Act to provide Technical support to the Commission on all firearms matters.

“OTHER RELATED MATERIALS”: Means all components, parts or spare parts for all conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunition and other arms listed in the National Control List or ammunition necessary for its functioning, or any chemical substances such as acid serving as active material used as propelling or explosive agents.

CHAPTER III: ESTABLISHMENT

Section 3.1: There is hereby established a National Commission to be known as the Liberia National Commission on Arms, hereinafter referred as the “Arms Commission” , which shall have the mandates and exercise the functions and powers granted it by this Act.

Section 3.2: The Commission shall have its principle office in Monrovia or adjacent counties, and may establish offices and appoint or assign staff and agents anywhere within the Republic.

CHAPTER IV: MANDATES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMISSION

Section 4.1: The general mandate of the Commission shall consist of formulating policies and ensuring the implementation of such policies and measures aimed at addressing the problem of proliferation, diversion, illicit manufacturing, use, distribution, possession and trafficking of all conventional arms; coordinating and monitoring of all private and public sector efforts to prevent, combat and eradicate the proliferation, diversion, illicit trade, transfer, transit, transshipment in all conventional arms and weapons within and across the borders of Liberia.

Section 4.2: Without limiting the generality of Subsection 4 below of this Chapter, the Commission shall coordinate all government Institutions and collaborate with international agencies involved in conventional arms control and have the following specific functions:

- a. To develop and implement, or cause to be implemented under its oversight, a national policy, strategy and/or section plan on all conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunition and other related materials control in Liberia;
- b. To provide regular briefings and reports to the president and Legislature on the progress and challenges in the implementation of the national policy on all conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunition and other related materials with the aim of facilitating the necessary political will, understanding and support for activities and programs dealing with conventional arms;
- c. To collaborate and share information with other Arms Commissions and National Arms Coordination Agencies, existing now or to be established hereafter in the region and in the world; to also collaborate with other regional, sub-regional and international organizations, public and private institutions and defense industry similarly engaged with tackling the problem of small arms and light weapons; and, in connection thereto; to ensure the execution and implementation of agreements as would be required in the effective discharge of its mandate.
- d. To conduct or commission research, studies and surveys to gather accurate information on the impact (s) of interventions, the mutating dimension, if any, of the problem of conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunition and other related materials, and the lessons learned; and to use such information

deciding the content, timing and phasing/sequencing of future activities and strategies;

e. To identify, confirm and mobilize the resources necessary to support implementation of the activities and task involved in tackling the challenging problem of conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunition and other related materials;

f. To coordinate the design and implementation of effective public education and awareness campaigns (through print, electronic including social media) on the effective management and control of conventional arms, including small arms, light weapons, explosives and other related materials.

g. To ensure that Liberia fulfills its reporting obligations on the transfers and control of conventional arms, including small arms and light weapons, and submit reports to the relevant regional, sub-regional or international bodies.

h. To enhance and ensure public security and safety by advising on the destruction of all conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, ammunitions and explosives and stockpile management facilities;

i. To formulate regulations governing the import, export, manufacture and repair, ownership and registration, sale and transfer of conventional weapons, explosives and related materials;

j. To coordinate with the Liberia National Police (LNP) and other State Security Agencies requirements and process descriptions on the marking and registration of all firearms including illicit or confiscated firearms;

k. Establish a National Arms Registry;

l. To provide training around the possession and use of conventional arms including the establishment of an institute for training and granting of diplomas and certificates in Physical Security Stockpile Management (PSSM);

m. To establish a Trust Fund to implement other programs of the Commission;

n. To issue regulations stating the composition and tenure, operations and funding of the Trust Funds;

o. To advise the Government of Liberia on all exemption requests to ECOWAS for the importation of arms, ammunition and other related materials;

p. To serve as the Principal National Point of Contact, for the coordination and as the Administrative and sole licensing Authority responsible for the implementation of the LiNCA act, as well as, the control of all categories of conventional arms including small arms, light weapons, their ammunition and other related materials as specified in the National Control List;

- q. **To establish a Technical Review Board** for vetting of applications for all licenses related to trade, transfer, transshipment of all conventional arms, including licenses for dealers, brokers, manufacturers, importers and exporters, except possession licenses and make recommendations for such licensing: the Commission in collaboration with the Liberia National Police and upon approval of the office of the National Security Advisor shall issue licenses to individuals as recommended by the Technical Review Board;
- r. **Establish standards** consistent with the ECOWAS Convention on Small Arms and Light Weapons and succeeding conventions and Arms Trade Treaty, for the control of conventional arms including their trade, transfer, transshipment and brokering;
- s. **Establish a National Control System** including a National Control List for all firearms and ammunition subject to the control of the Commission;
- t. **Conduct quarterly** and/or ad-hoc intelligence on illicit arms activities;
- u. **Collaborate** where applicable with other National Security Agencies quarterly or ad-hoc inspections of all State and private armories/storage facilities; and
- v. **Conduct registration and licensing** of Civilian arms as required by the Amended Firearms and Ammunition Control Act.

Chapter V: COMPOSITION, LEADERSHIP AND MEETINGS

Section 5.1: Board Membership Composition: The Commission shall have a Board membership comprising of representatives of government agencies and civil society organization for a tenure of five (5) years. There shall also be individuals to be appointed by the President who shall also have a tenure for five (5) years. The membership shall be:

- a. **The Presidency**, represented by the Office of the National Security Advisor and Senior Officer, each of the Executive Protection Services (EPS) and the National Security Agency;
- b. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, represented by the Department of International Cooperation;
- c. The Ministry of Justice, represented preferably by a Senior Legal Officer from the office of the Minister of Justice; one Senior Officer from the Liberia National Police (LNP); and other Security Agencies as deemed necessary on a case by case basis;
- d. The Ministry of Defense, represented by a Senior Official of the Ministry of Defense and a Senior Officer of the Armed Forces of Liberia (AFL);
- e. The Ministry of Finance Development Planning (MFDP), represented by a senior Official responsible for Budget;
- f. The Liberia Revenue Authority, represented by a Senior Officer of the Department of Custom and Excise;

- g. The Ministry of Internal Affairs, represented by a Senior Official of its Operations Department;
- h. The Ministry of Education, represented by a Senior Official;
- i. The Forestry Development Authority (FDA), represented by a Senior Official;
- j. Two representatives of the Inter-Religious Council;
- k. Three representatives from a reputable Coalition of Civil Society Organizations duly register in Liberia working on conventional arms issue-one of whom shall be from a Women's Organization, another from Youth Groups, and the other from the National Traditional Council; and;
- l. Representatives from three (3) private sector Institutions with interest in arms, peace and security;

Section 5.2 Board Meetings

The Board of the Commission shall meet as frequently as necessary for the effective discharge of its mandate, but at least once every quarter. The formal meeting shall be complimented, where possible, by virtual meetings and regular emails. The Commission shall adopt rules to govern its conduct and schedule of meetings and other activities, including the determination quorum; the procedures for calling for regular meetings and special meetings; and the conditions under which notice for a meeting may be required, served or dispensed with.

Section 5.3 Leadership

The President shall appoint three (3) Commissioners who shall hold office with good behavior for five (5) years' renewable only once and shall be removed for cause which includes proven misconduct, breach of duties, abuse of office, conviction of a felony, and corruption. The appointment of Commissioners shall include at least one female.

Section 5.4 Titles

The President shall appoint one of the three (3) individual Commissioners as Chairperson, another as the Vice Chairperson and the other as a Commissioner.

Section 5.5 Disclosure of Conflicts Of Interest

The Commissioner shall disclose any potential conflict of interest that hinder the full and objective of their duties.

Section 5.6 Establishment as Autonomous Agency:

The Commission shall be an autonomous agency of the Government with semi- financial autonomy and shall operate independently in the execution of its mandate in accordance with Article 89 of the Constitution of the Republic of Liberia;

CHAPTER VI. ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATIONS:

Section 6.1 Chairperson:

6.1.1. Authority: The Chairperson of the Commission shall exercise executive authority over the Commission. He/she shall be responsible for the overall supervision of the Commission's mandate and execution of its functions and decisions; He /She shall be the official head and spokesperson of the Commission; Call or authorize call of meetings of the Commission; preside at meetings of the Commission; preside at meetings at the Commission membership in the absence of the Office of the President (National Security Advisor); supervise the operations of the Commission; and submit annual report to the membership and the President of the Republic of Liberia. In the absence and or permanent removal of the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson shall act until such time the President shall appoint a Chairperson. The President can only remove and or replace the Chairperson before the expiration of his/her tenure for a cause which includes proven misconduct, breach of duties, abuse of office, conviction of felony, and corruption.

6.1.2. Qualification

The Chairperson shall possess an advance degree or equivalent in Security, Law, Peace Studies, International Relations, Public Administration or related areas, with at least five (5) years' experience in the field of weapons and ammunition management, security sector, litigation, conflict resolution, public sector management and related areas.

Section: 6.2. Vice Chairperson:

6.2.1. Authority: The Vice Chairperson shall be the principal deputy to the Chairperson in the discharge of the duties of that office. He/She shall assist the Chairperson in executing the executive authority of the Commission and perform other duties as may be assigned by the Chairperson. Act as head of the Commission in the absence or inability of the Chairperson. In the case of absence due to suspension, dismissal, removal, expiration of tenure, incapacity, the Vice Chairperson shall not make employment decisions, dismissal, committing institution to financial liability in an amount to be determined by the Commission's financial policy.

6.2.2 Qualification: The Vice Chairperson shall possess an advanced degree or equivalent in Security, Law, Peace Studies, International Relations, Public Administration or related areas with five (5) years' experience in the field of weapons and ammunition management, security sector, litigation, conflict resolution, public sector management and related areas. The Vice Chairperson shall possess an advanced degree in Security, aw, Peace Studies, Public Administration or related area.

6.3 Commissioner

6.3.1. **Authority:** The Commissioner under the supervision of the Chairperson or his/her designee shall liaise with all Government Defense and Security Agencies, regional and international partners in enhancing capacity for efficient lifetime management and control of all Arms, Ammunition and Related Materials in Liberia. He/she shall perform other duties as may be assigned by the Chairperson.

6.3.2. Qualification: The Commissioner shall possess a minimum of undergraduate degree in Security, Law, or Peace Studies with at least five (5) years' experience in the field of weapons and ammunition management, security sector, litigation, conflict resolution, public sector management and related areas. He/she must possess knowledge in national security and must have served in a senior level position within the defense or Para-military agencies in Liberia.

Section 6.4: Technical Secretariat

a). The Technical Secretariat shall be headed by an Executive Director who shall run the day-to-day affairs of the Commission. He/she shall be appointed by the Commission through a recruitment process including internal promotion and, on such terms, and conditions as the Commission may establish. The Executive Director shall report to the Chairperson. He/she shall be assisted by a Deputy Executive Director with oversight on Programs and Public Education who shall act in place of the Executive Director in his/her absence.

b). **The Commission** shall have the following Departments: Administration, Programs, Finance, Technical, Revenue, Public Education, Procurement and ICT as such order departments as the Commission may establish for the conduct of its operations. Subject to budgetary allocation and good recruitment practices, the Chairperson may hire the services of competent professional staff to ensure the proper and efficient implementation of the functions and mandates of the Commission. Non-professional staff may be hired by the Executive Director using the internal recruitment processes with the approval of the Chairperson.

Section 6.5: Technical Committee on Arms (TCA)

A Technical Committee on Arms (TCA) shall be established within the Liberia National Commission on Arms. The TCA shall be composed of two (2) representatives each from the Liberia National Commission on Arms (LiNCA), Armed Forces of Liberia (AFL), Liberia National Police (LNP), Executive Protective Service (EPS), National Security Agency (NSA), Liberia Immigration Service (LIS), Liberia Drug Enforcement Agency (LDEA) and additional Government Defense and Security Ministries, Agencies and Commissions (MACS) that are authorized and vetted to bear arms; one of the two representatives from each institution shall be represented at the Commission; the TCA shall provide technical support to LiNCA in the implementation of conventional arms including Small Arms and Light Weapons (SAWL), ammunition and other related activities and explosives throughout the country. It shall provide support in all

Technical Firearms Matters; provide technical support on arms marking, arms collection/disarmament, destruction, record-keeping; support in the Fight against illicit proliferation and use of Firearms, supervise on Civilian Arms Licensing Process (including vetting, marking, licensing, providing technical support to the National Data Center to be established per FACA Regulations, and other duties as may be assigned. The Technical Committee on Arms shall report to the Chairperson of the Commission.

CHAPTER VII: FINANCIAL MATTERS

Section 7.1: The work of the Commission shall be financed by:

(a) The Government of Liberia through the National Budget by legislative appropriations and;

(b) **Financial autonomy** of internal revenue sources which include but not limited to fees paid for licenses including Manufacturers, Brokers, Dealers, Importers, Exporters, Repairers, possession to include permits. The Commission in collaboration with the Liberia National Police shall also levy Administrative fines pursuant to provisions in the Amended Firearms and Ammunition Control Act (FACA) and its regulations. Fees for permits and license shall be paid to an exclusive designated account (s) of the Commission and expanded for its operations.

(c) It shall be the responsibility of the Chairperson to ensure that the annual budget of the Commission is prepared and submitted in time to the membership and the Office of the President for inclusion in the National Budget.

Section 7.2: The Commission may organize fundraising activities to support its programs and activities. The commission may also request and receive technical assistance, donations, and grants from Liberia's development partners and international multilateral institutions, in furtherance of its operations, provided that such assistance, donations and grants shall further contribute to the peace and security and interest of Liberia and operated under a trust fund.

Section 7.3: There shall be established a Trust Fund which composition shall include government institutions, the business community, chamber of commerce, international partners, etc.

7.3.1 Purpose:

a. To support the multi-year strategic plan of the Commission including the decentralization of administrative and operational functions of the Commission;

b. To fund the National Action Plan for Arms Control for the implementation of the mandate of the Commission.

Section 7.4: The Commission shall adopt a system of sound accounting and financial management policies and practices in conformity with financial regulations of the Government of Liberia and generally accepted accounting principles to ensure prudent and efficient management of funds. The Commission shall especially cause to be kept, proper books and records of account for funds and resources received and expenditure incurred during each financial year.

Section 7.5:

- (a) “The accounts of the Commission shall be regularly audited by the General Auditing Commission and other private auditing firms where applicable;
- (b) Quarterly and/or ad-hoc arms intelligence expenditure of the Commission shall not be subjected to audit contemplated in section “a” above; except required by the President and such expenditure shall be considered classified in the interest of the security of the state.

CHAPTER VIII: MISCELLANEOUS

Section 8.1: The Chairperson of the Commission shall provide briefings to the President quarterly and as the President requires, and regular updates at the quarterly meetings of the Membership, and to the Legislature annually, on the Commission’s activities and plans in pursuit of its mandate.

Section 8.2: The Inspector General of the Liberia National Police shall provide to the Commission, through the Ministry of Justice, detailed quarterly reports of all individuals who meet the firearms qualification, firearms related violence, deaths and crimes. The Inspector General of the Liberia National Police shall also provide monthly reports of all seized firearms and ammunitions.

Section 8: All Senior staff of the Commission and persons serving in specialized roles shall be subjected to background checks and shall sign a confidentiality form to keep the information of the Commission confidential.

CHAPTER IX: TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Section 9.1: Transfer of Property, Obligations and Authority

(a) On the effective date of this Act, all properties except any such property that the Office of the President (National Security Advisor) may determine, that immediately before the effective date was vested in the Government for the use of the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms shall, without further assurances rest in the Liberia National Commission on Arms, and without associated interest, liabilities, charges, obligations affecting that property. The Office of the President (National Security Advisor) may direct the transfer of other property owned by the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms to facilitate the expanded mandate of the Liberia National Commission on Arms which shall be without any associated interest, liabilities, charges, obligations affecting that property.

(b) All contracts, debts and liabilities of the Government attributable to the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms immediately prior to the effective date of this Act shall remain vested in the Government and are enforceable by or against the Government.

(c) **Arms records kept** by the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms including other documents (classified and unclassified) in the possession of the Commission immediately before the effective date of this Act shall become records and documents of the Liberia National Commission on Arms.

Section 9.2: Existing Officials and Employees

(a). Upon coming into force of this Act, presidential appointees of the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms with unexpired tenure, including the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Commissioner, shall continue to serve the Liberia National Commission on Arms in their current positions until the expiration of their tenures. The President of Liberia may reappoint the said officials consistent with the provision of this Act in Chapter V Section 5.1 above.

b). **The employees of the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms** shall be deemed duly employed with the Liberia National Commission on Arms upon passage of this Act, except those that are under i) administrative or criminal investigation, ii) at retirement age or iii) retirement tenure.

(c). The benefits to be accrued shall be counted for years of service under LiNCA.

(d). In furtherance of Section 3.4.9 of the Civil Service Standing Order, all employees transfer in accordance with Section 2(b) above shall be transferred with their salary and conditions to service not less than those attached to their existing appointment as employees of the Liberia National Commission on Small Arms on the effective date of this Act.

(e). All employees transferred under this Act shall cease to be Civil Servants and their terms and conditions of their contracts of their employment shall be subject to the Decent Work Act of Liberia and its successor legislation.

CHAPTER X: EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 101: This Act shall take effect immediately upon publication into handbills.


